Dr Blair Lonsberry

We are delighted to welcome, for the first time at SRC, Canadian Dr Blair Lonsberry. Blair's impressive list of qualifications includes a Master of Science in Physiology, an Optometry degree and a Masters in Education. As an educator Blair understands the needs of adult, professional learners and is committed to creating an interactive learning environment. At SRC he will cover topics including diagnostic testing for systemic disease and the management of urgent presentations. Currently, Dr. Lonsberry is a Full Professor and Clinic Director at the Portland Vision Center associated with Pacific University in Portland, Oregon.



Dr Jim Thimons

Jim is an acclaimed and highly-awarded clinical educator and international speaker, with over 200 publications to his name in ocular disease management and glaucoma. He was the founding director of the Glaucoma Institute at the State University of New York, founded a multi-disciplinary consultancy providing secondary and tertiary care in 2002, and has held appointments at a number of US universities. Jim is also an experienced investigator in optometric and ophthalmic clinical trials. In 1999, he was named optometry's top educator in the US, and was selected as one of the Top Ten ODs of the decade. He has also recently served as President of the Connecticut Association of Optometrists. In 2005, Jim was inducted into the US Optometry Hall of Fame.
